1. Supreme Court practice: for practice in the Supreme Court of the United States

By Stephen Shapiro

Supreme Court practice was first published in 1950 and authored by Eugene Gressman and Robert Stern. The authors of the 10th edition stay true to the original mission of providing everything there is to know about handling a case before the U.S. Supreme Court in one volume. Despite its daunting size, this is an easy to use resource. The detailed table of contents is followed by concise checklists for "processing certiorari cases, appeals and cases accepted by the Court for plenary review." There are numerous appendices that bring together laws, court rules, clerk's guidelines, and forms. There are even floor plans for the court building included. 2. Texas practitioner's guide to civil appeals, 2014 By Robert Dubose

The Texas practitioner's guide to civil appeals was written by the attorneys from the appellate firm of Alexander Dubose Jefferson & Townsend LLP. This volume distinguishes itself from other appellate titles in its focus on strategy rather than procedural rules. For example, Chapter 10, entitled "Sections of an appellant's brief," provides guidance on proper form according to the rules and continues with additional tips on the "unwritten conventions" that should be followed to ensure the best first impression. Advice is also given on how to format briefs for readers using electronic copies instead of paper copies. The handbook concludes with tips on using technology and building an appellate practice. In the final part of the book, he discusses how the 2008 landmark Supreme Court case *D.C. v. This two-way communication forms the basis of trust in the attorney-client relationship. Communication is also important in obtaining the trust of witnesses to enable credibile testimony. Micro-inequities are defined by the author as "tiny, damaging characteristics of an environment...these characteristics affect a person not indigenous to that environment. They are distinguished by the fact that for all practical purposes one cannot do anything about them; one cannot take them to court or file a grievance" (xxii). The title looks at ten common micro-inequities and how to address them. The micro-inequities discussed are informal mentoring, the ability to recover from a mistake, bullying, perceived underperformance, dealing with insensitivity, receiving quality work assignments, navigating dual identities, issues with assumptions and slights, first generation hurdles, and isolation. All Texas residents can access these databases by registering for a Texas State Law Library card. Texas residents can register for a Texas State Law Library card in person at the library or online by visiting: http://www.sll.texas.gov/library-card/

This card allows access to the databases for three months. After three months, the card can be renewed for an additional three months. To check out print materials or access our in library use only databases, you must come to the library in person and present a valid form of Texas identification.
